It is my job is to work closely with students, parents and other agencies to make sure this happens. Starting secondary school can be quite an anxious time, which is perfectly normal, so students may find themselves being supported by me, but don't worry I'm a good listener, and hopefully through developing some coping strategies and encouragement, you will enjoy and achieve at Oldbury Academy!



My name is Ms LaTouche and my role is to be a Point of contact to parents regarding their child's attendance (i.e. reporting absences, requesting unauthorised absence/holiday forms, providing evidence to explain child's absence [medical or other], having parent meetings etc). I also carry out safe & well visits when their child has been absent for 3 days or more and support them to help their child to improve on their attendance to prevent legal action from occurring.

In the Attendance Office we have an 'open door policy', meaning that students are welcome to speak to either myself or the Attendance Officers (Mr Windmill, Mrs Samra & Miss Gilbert), to discuss their attendance percentage, their punctuality (i.e signing in) and to inform us of any appointments etc to sign out of school (evidence & contact from parent/carer will be required). We do encourage all students to maintain a high attendance and punctuality standard throughout the year, to enable them to perform well in their lessons (avoiding missing work or crucial information) and to be a reliable student and individual in future too.




Hi!
